

# Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting Scholarship Program

## Missions

1. This Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting Scholarship for Missions is to aid with a Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting student's college costs to prepare for Evangelical Friends mission service. This scholarship could also be used by a current missionary who wishes to further their education.
2. The student applying for a Missions scholarship must be a full-time upper-class college student (Junior/Senior) or in a graduate program.
3. He/she must give a clear and up-to-date testimony of a born-again experience.
4. He/she must give a definite witness to God's calling into missionary service, which would include ministerial training, evangelism, multiplying small groups, starting house churches, leadership development and Christian Education.
5. He/she should preferably be a member of Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting. If there are no applicants from RMYM, consideration may be given to a qualified applicant from another Evangelical Friends yearly meeting who is planning to enter Evangelical Friends mission service.
6. The Scholarship Committee has the liberty to consider a deserving student from RMYM preparing for full-time missions work that may be attending a Christian College or seminary other than a Friends school in years that a student from a Friends school does not apply.
7. He/she shall send an application to the Scholarship Committee at the Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting Office before the deadline of May 1<sup>st</sup>.
8. The student should be willing, if possible, to do on-the-job training at an Evangelical Friends Mission (EFM) location for a period.
9. The Scholarship Committee must receive letters of reference from a pastor, a teacher, a business person and a friend.
10. This scholarship is for one student, \$500 per semester, or \$1000 per year, depending upon the setup of the school he/she attends.
11. If several students are applying for the scholarship, it is preferable to give the scholarship to one qualified student.
12. The final awarding of the scholarship would be subject to discussion and approval of the Rocky Mountain Yearly Meeting Elder Board.
